

God continues to do an amazina work within Ogilville Christian Church. For the eightconsecutive eenth year OCC has increased its attendance average over the preceding year. In fact, this past year shattered the previous all-time high weekly attendance average of 275 set in 2012, with OCC averaging an incredible 292 in our Sunday services in 2013. OCC also witnessed 15 baptisms and 10 transfers of membership in Weekly giving 2013. remained strong averaging above \$6,000 a week for the second

year in a row, with a weekly giving average \$6,376 in 2013.

"What God has done and continues to do here is incredible!" said OCC minis-Martin Wright. ter, "God has blessed us with faithful leaders, committed volunteers. generous members and innovative minis-Over the past tries. eighteen years God has not only encouraged our spirits, He restored has our church to health and renewed our strenath so that we might fully be involved in His mission in our time and place. The past eighteen years are a testament to the power of prayer and God's faithfulness to His people. The continued growth is a strong indicator people are experiencing God in real and powerful ways here."

New Policies:

Calendar, Building, Equipment Reservation, & Announcements

As OCC has grown, its ministries have multiplied and expanded. As much as this is a blessing, it also brings about certain complexities as ministries now find themselves requesting the same calendar dates, building space usage and announcement placements. Because of this developing circumstance, it has become necessary for us to adopt the following procedures for requesting dates, scheduling rooms and submitting announcements.

In order for us to coordinate and communicate effectively, we ask our ministry leaders to follow the new guidelines listed below:

Please secure and confirm your dates and room reservation for all OCC related events through our official calendar-coordinator and church secretary, Benita Wagner. You may either stop by the OCC office, call Benita at 812-342-6907 or email occsecretary@comcast.net.

After confirming your date and location, should you wish to publicize your event, we ask that any and all publication and announcement requests for the bulletin be submitted by 10:30 a.m. on the Wednesday prior to the weekend service. The bulletin will be processed and published by office secretary Benita Wagner. The newsletter will be processed and published by Mona Peterson (edited by Kathleen Schwein). We remind you that our publication team is available to support your ministry and would be happy to help create your publications/ads if needed.

When church supplies (i.e. tables, chairs, etc.) are needed during a public or private off-campus event, please reserve items in advance and coordinate a pick-up and return time with our church secretary to ensure supplies are readily available for all simultaneous events.
