What does recovery from addiction mean? There is no clear answer that will be the right one for everyone. There is not a definition on addiction that all people will garee on so, how can recovery be defined? I know that many people in our congregation suffer from many issues. Some people have substance abuse issues, eating disorders, mental health issues, sexual addictions, and the list goes on and on. People can be addicted to food, gambling, nicotine, caffeine, pornography, marijuana, even prescription medications. Addictions come in many forms.

When the OCC Addiction Outreach Team was developed and a plan began to unfold, we decided we needed to address so many topics that the best approach was to begin a Celebrate Recovery meeting for our com-

munity. Celebrate Recovery is a Christ-centered program with foundations firmly established in Biblical truth. The 12 Steps with accompanying Scriptures and the 8 Principles based on the Beatitudes offer participants a clear path towards Christ and discipleship. Celebrate Recovery embraces the reality that the true Higher Power--Jesus Christ--brings hope, freedom, sobriety, healing, and opportunity into our lives.

Celebrate recovery utilizes Biblical teachings and truth to help people with hurts, habits and hang ups. This allows people with grief, shame, co-dependency, addictions, or anything that is controlling their lives in a destructive manner to make changes and offers these individuals support from a group of people that also are dealing with similar issues. Celebrate Recovery is not a

counseling program and it is not an answer to all that our community needs, but it is and will be a great support and a hand up to many in our area who are suffering in their addictions.

We have completed necessary steps to have our church listed as a state meeting and will comply with guidelines of the Celebrate Recovery program. Meetings will be open to the public Tuesday nights at 6:30 pm in the OCC Café starting March 7,2017. The OCC Addiction Outreach Team will continue to encourage our congregation and community to recognize the person beside you may be suffering in silence and it is not necessary to do that any longer.

1. CHRISTIAN WORLD VIEW is a 6-week elective to be taught by one of our area pastors, Al White. The probable dates are August 6—September 10. Synopsis: As believers, we look at the world in a far different way

than non-believers. This biblical, faith based perspective affects every aspect of life and it is very important we know WHO we are, WHAT we believe, WHY we think the way we do, and HOW we apply this unique and spiritual outlook to all things. It's a valuable and important subject to discuss and study.

2. RESTORATION MOVEMENT HISTORY AND PRINCIPLES is a 5-week elective to be taught by Cincinnati Christian University Professor, Dr. Jim North. It will meet October 15—November 12. Synopsis: OCC traces its heritage to a spiritual awakening movement of the American frontier that came to the

forefront in the early 1800's. It is a movement with a fascinating history and it built primarily on the eternal goal of the unity of all believers under the authority of the Scripture. Dr. North is an amazing teacher who has a gift of making church and R. M. history come alive.
