A Tale of Two (or more) Birdies

Dove to Bluejay: Every time you come here, you leave a mess. You fling seed and shells all over the place. Not only that, but you're loud and obnoxious. You never make a quiet entrance. Your voice makes my feathers stand on end!

Bluejay's Retort: Oh yeah? What about you? You never say anything, and if you do, no one can hear it anyway. All you ever do is waddle around. You're the laziest bird I know!

They come to the feeders all year round, whenever there's food. Just who makes up this conglomerate of visitors? There are all different types including the more common species, such as finches and sparrows, more raucous species including the bluejay, and various woodpeck-

ers. Some birds merely waddle on the ground waiting for leftovers while others actively assemble at the feeder. The bluebird never comes to the deck, preferring a more open, less crowded, space. Then there's that single little wren with a flipped-up tail. That one characteristic makes him unique among the others.

I am particularly amused by the interaction between the jay bird and the dove, for while one noisily flings the seed everywhere, the other quietly cleans it up. Both are fed; both temperaments dovetail. (See what I did there?)

Sometimes they're crowded together so tightly that they step on each other and their wings collide. Sometimes they bicker loudly, but this is where food is; this is where they

come if they want to feed.

I don't supply the same food for all of them. My bluebird likes to eat mealworms, a repast that I find a bit repugnant, but then I am not a bird. (In my defense however, he seems to be the only visitor that really enjoys them, so it's not just me.) Some prefer sunflower seeds while others dine on Nyjer thistle seed, but they all seem to enjoy the suet feeder.

I provide for them and they gladly accept. They don't really know who I am, but they don't need to; I still derive great pleasure from their antics and they enjoy the food.

I'll stop now and let you toy with your own analogies. But I have to say, I almost always see the Body of Christ at my bird feeders.
