Better to be a Christian that Shows It than Knows It



Hardened and unable to find work, Valjean finally makes his way to the home of a good old bishop, who gives him supper and a bed for the night. serves Valjean using his best silver platters and

candlesticks, which Valjean recognizes as being highly valuable.

Yielding to temptation, Valjean steals the bishop's silver plates but is soon caught and returned by watchful police. When shown the silver plates, the bishop says to the policeman, "Why, I gave them to him." And then turning to Valjean , he adds, "And Jean, you forgot to take the candlesticks." A shocked and eternally

grateful Valjean accepts the candlesticks as more than valuable silver pieces, but as expressions of love beyond measure. The bishop's act brought about a true repentance and changed life.
