

Like the little engine that thought it could do something big, our once little church has proven it can, too! For twenty straight years, Ogilville Christian Church has experienced attendance growth. Over the past two decades the congregation has nearly tripled in size, growing from a congregation of 114 weekly attendees in 1995 to a congregation of 331 weekly attendees in 2015.

It's a feat that is perhaps even more impressive when one understands that many rural churches in America have either ceased to grow or are losing members. In fact, in their book "Legacy Churches"; Dr. Stephen Gray and Dr. Franklin Dumond claim that "roughly 80 percent of the churches in America are in a state of plateau or decline." Church research specialist and consultant Thom Ranier recently indicated that between 8,000 and 10,000 churches are closing each year. Rural churches in communities with declining populations are especially vulnerable, yet Ogilville Christian Church continues to thrive and to grow year after year!

Ogilville Christian's minister, Martin Wright, described the situation as "a God thing!" "It's one of those occasions where you see all the reasons it should be impossible for this church to do what it's doing: declining population around the church, located in a rural community, the church is over 100 years old, the preacher isn't young, hip, or cool and our facilities are undersized. And yet, in spite of all the obstacles to growth, we grow anyway!" "It's a God thing and it is absolutely awesome to be a part of it!" The recent addition of a third worship opportunity, the hiring of an additional fulltime staff member, and ongoing outreach and discipleship strategies have only accelerated the growth. Truly, it is an amazing time for Ogilville Christian Church.

2016 is our 4th year and we have been greatly blessed. When Wayne and I started the Men's Breakfast in 2013, our goal was two-fold. First, we wanted to create an environment that would allow men to build closer relationships with God and closer relationships with each other. As you know, men are funny creatures; our need for relationships is usually greater than our willingness to make the efforts needed to build them. We thought food was a great mechanism to draw men together. Second, we believe that building those relationships in-turn will make us better men, more accountable men and better leaders in our homes, churches, workplaces and world. I believe with God's blessing and our work those goals are being accomplished and we are blessed to be a part of it.

We meet on the 3rd Saturday of

every month in the OCC fellowship hall at 7am. I would like to tell you we haven't missed a month over the past 3 years, but we have had to cancel few times for schedule conflicts, holidays and weddings. We are hopeful that record will improve as we have asked some of the regular attendees to help us prepare so that one, we can get those interested involved, but also, so Wayne and I will have back-ups if we are unable to host.

Wayne and I get started around 5:30am and prepare a pretty manly menu. Typically: biscuits, made-fromscratch sausage gravy, bacon, eggs and fried potatoes. Breakfast is ready around 7am. We then have a short blessing over the meal and eat. Around 7:30am, Wayne or I share a short devotion we have prepared and how we feel it relates to our lives

and roles as men in our workplaces, churches and homes. The discussion is then opened to the entire group so they too can contribute their insights and interpretation. In closing, we share our praises and concerns with each other and close the meeting in prayer. We usually wrap up pretty close to 8, but sometimes we run to 8:30.


