God's Inspiration Becomes A Reality

The Inspiration

Jeff and Marcia Potts and their family began attending OCC in January of 2014. Soon after, God placed in Marcia's heart the passion to take a class on how to create stained glass; mid-January, she began a sixweek course. After she had completed the class, she remembers sitting in church one particular Sunday when a picture of a sinner kneeling at the foot of Jesus with the cross looming in the background was placed on the overhead screen. The three elements: Jesus, a sinner and the cross with its dark, solemn undertones, drew her in. Suddenly, she felt God pulling her attention to the idea of placing those elements into a stained glass picture to replace the glass already in the entryway. In what became a Godinspired image of the three mentioned. elements without the darkness of the previous picture, Marcia drew an image to present to the Elders in July of 2015.

The Sinner, Jesus and the Cross

When Marcia began drawing the picture, she needed to keep every line in mind. Everything, each line, must flow to and from Jesus, radiating to Him; He is the center. The blue of the sky in between the sun's rays accentuates even further the light being drawn toward Jesus. The entire idea must center on the light radiating out from Jesus as we, the sinners, are drawn to the light. Of the four panels, Jesus flows over into three panels; he is the most important aspect. He is completely clear with different textures of clear glass symbolizing our walk by faith not by sight; all we have in our minds is an outlined image of what we believe is Jesus' appearance.

As mentioned, the project in itself is broken into four panels



and the sinner is broken between two panels; he is "broken," quite literally, before Jesus. In the beginning stages, Marcia considered the sinner's glass color to be brown to symbolize the dirt, the filth of sin. Upon further consideration, it was decided that the sinner not be dark but opaque, see through, because God sees through all our sin.

Lastly, we cannot do without the cross, in all its significance, looming in the background. Its inspiration is of the old rugged cross. Marcia was able to find a glass with the right amount of rough texture to signify that look. Each tiny detail came together to make the image what it is.

Timeline and Collaborative Teams

Marcia began drawing the weekend of July the 4th, 2015.

She made one panel per month in her kitchen from August to November and completed the glass on Thanksgiving morning. Along with working on the project individually, OCC members, Carolyn Pruitt, Dorri Clotfelter, Sandy Johnson, and Barty and Kathy Moffett joined her several hours during each week to create the glass picture. Barty also engineered the metal framing in order to give the artwork the strength to be neld upright. The final installations

held upright. The final installation team included: Keith Kennick, Morris Bolin and Wayne Roller (wood framing & mounting) Chad Stadler (wood stain) and Frank George (electrical). The glass was placed in a protective glass barrier before being mounting in the entryway for its final position. The piece was installed on Friday, March the 4th, 2016.


