Sometimes I receive questions about why OCC does certain things certain ways. In general, I can tell you that OCC attempts, as much as possible, to imitate the New Testament church and its practices. As author Leroy Lawson explains it, "that is why our baptism is by immersion, our Communion is every Lord's Day, our leaders are called elders, our preaching is about Christ, and our prayers are in Christ's name. Even our church name is rooted in the earliest days, when disciples were first called Christians." Where the Bible speaks, we speak; where the Bible is silent we extend grace. As you consider your actions on any subject, your church leadership encourages you to consult your Bible for direction. Martin Wright

Below is the meditation given by Zech Riggs on Sunday, April 24th, explaining the meaning behind the Christian fellowship of communion:

The early Christians broke bread and drank of the cup every week for the Lord's Supper...but why did the early church celebrate the Lord's Sup-

per every week?

Why did they assemble on Sunday? They came to participate in the great celebration of fellowship, to commune together as they shared the Lord's Supper. In so doing, they were remembering the core beliefs of their faith: that Jesus died for their sins and rose on the third day.

Taking communion or the Lord's Supper was not a passive experience. They did more than hear the spoken word. Their fingers touched the bread as they remembered Christ's body broken for them. Their tongues tasted the wine as they recalled Christ's blood shed for them. They celebrated the new covenant, the gracious invitation of God to believe in his Son and thereby be saved.

It takes a new way of thinking, a paradigm shift, to understand the weekly celebration of the Lord's Supper. The question is not, "Why do we have it every week?" The question is, "Why do we meet every week?" We all come to meet around a table of fellowship offered by Christ to all believers...all who believe that Jesus is the Christ and truly is the son of God.

When we are taking communion, Paul says in 1 Corinthians 11 that there should be a spirit of unity (vv. 17-19). The Lord's Supper is a community meal and should reinforce and reflect our essential unity in Christ.

There should also be a spirit of humility (vv. 20-22). There is no place at the table for feelings of superiority since we are all sinners in need of a Savior. There should also be a spirit of thanksgiving (v. 23). If Jesus' sacrifice doesn't deserve thanks, nothing does.

There should be a spirit of admiration (vv. 24, 25). After all, the emblems tell us of the death of Christ and remind us of our own forgiveness. That should inspire worship in anyone who takes it seriously.

And, surprisingly, Paul says there should a spirit of expectation (v. 26). Remembering something is not the only reason for the Lord's Supper. It involves the past, present, and even the future. We look forward to that time when the Lord will return to dine with us in eternity.




