John Riggs is the Assistance Warden of the female-only facility and personally leads three women's Bible studies throughout the week, one of which was the "End of Me" series recently completed by ourchurch-wide small groups.

During this four-week small group, 52 women were in attendance and the books are currently spreading around the prison like a wildfire. Since he began this ministry in Madison, Indiana, 32 women have made the commitment to follow Jesus Christ and show this dedication in humble

This is a wonderful opportunity for so many of the ladies to begin planting the seeds of Christ's love in the hearts of those with which they share a home.
