OCC will launch our new Sunday morning schedule on October 2, 2016. The changes have been made primarily to help us offer a balanced attendance in the two services provided. We have included a longer open time between the services to allow for traffic and crowd flow. Plans are currently in place to add up to 20-25 more parking spaces on the east side when needed.

We understand that a smooth transition between the services means that we do our consistent best to keep our services to 60-65 minutes in length. For the present, Donut Sunday will no longer be offered in our new morning

schedule, although children's groups may occasionally do a snack time. Parents will be notified prior to snack days.

Baby Dedication Service

On Sunday, September 11th, our 10:00am worship service will include a very special and important time of Baby Dedication. We host this event because we have a sense that God intends faith to be lived in a family context. Parents have the greatest opportunity to shape their child's spiritual development. Likewise, God seems to place a great portion of the responsibility for a child's faith and spirituality on the parents.

Understanding the responsibility and the opportunity parents face, Ogilville Christian Church utilizes Baby Dedication Day as an occasion for parents to pledge to God



and the congregation that they are serious about the task that is before them. We ask parents to commit themselves to raise their child to know the Lord Jesus Christ by loving, disciplining, training, and setting a positive Christlike example for their children to follow. Alongside of our parents, our church family also recommits itself to love and minister to our children

and to provide ample opportunities for them to grow in their faith and knowledge of Jesus Christ.

Because the covenantal promise to God is made by the parents and not the child, we do not include baby baptism as part of the dedication service. It is our sense that baptism is meant to take place at a time when an individual makes a personal decision to follow Christ and is old enough to repent of sin and confess Jesus publicly.

Our children's welfare is important to each of us. Our goal is to provide a safe environment free from abuse, including sexual abuse. Ogilville Christian Church desires to implement a policy and procedures that provide reasonable and prudent care in this area. We want all who supervise and care for our children to understand the seriousness and scope of the issue, to understand the church's policy and agree to abide by it, and to accept the inconvenience that comes with screening all childcare providers.

Sometimes doing the right thing in the right way is more bothersome than just letting things slide. But when it comes to the welfare of our children, we go the extra mile to do it right. We hope

you agree that protecting our children, protecting our youth workers, and protecting the church's legal exposure are all worthwhile and necessary goals, and worth the effort.

Our purposes are threefold:

- Safeguard the children. Our goal is to eliminate the likelihood of any sexual abuse occurring to any of our children involved in any program or activity of the church.
- Protect our childcare providers, church staff and leaders, and the congregation from allegations of child sexual abuse.
- 3. Limit the extent of the church's legal risk and liability.

A child protection class will be offered Saturday, September 17 from 8am-12pm and Sunday, October 16 from 2-6pm both in the Café. The class' purpose is to educate our childcare providers, leaders and church members about the reality of child sexual abuse in our world and offer training toward the practical steps we have taken for prevention at OCC. This class is the crucial first step of our comprehensive Child Sexual Abuse Protection Policy & Procedures and it leads towards our goal of individual 'certification' which is a requirement for all who will supervise youth from infant through teen ages. Certified over-sight is required for all programs, teaching, etc. at OCC.



Children's Programming at Both Services

As we prepare to move to new service times on October 2nd, we are happy to announce that we will be offering FULL children's programming at both the 9am service AND the 10:30am service. This means the Nursery (infant – 24 months), Wee Worship (age 2&3), His Kids (age 4-6K) and KidZone (grades 1-6) will be available at both service times.

Children can attend one or both service times and receive excellent care and great teaching along with energetic music, activities and fun. The two children's services will have similarities, but also differences. For example, His Kids will study the same story at both the 9 and 10:30 services, but all

Money from both the entry fee and additional sponsorship will benefit the Aruna Project, an international human rights organization focused on bringing and sustaining freedom to the sexually enslaved in South Asia through employment marked by holistic care. 

Freedom 400 Mile Bike Race SEPTEMBER EVENT

Remember when you first learned how to ride a bicycle? Remember that feeling of freedom and excitement? Then after a few years, the bicycle was pushed aside when you got your driver's license, rarely to be ridden again. Sound familiar? Well, for some reason, I never lost that initial feeling and God has allowed me to use my passion for cycling to help others. In 2012 I rode across the country to raise money for a well in Kenya through I.D.E.S. For the past several summers, I've ridden several one day rides across Indiana to benefit Mission Resource and their work in giving 0% interest loans to small businesses in Ghana while sharing Jesus Christ.

I feel blessed every day for the opportunity God has given me to rally support around my cycling efforts by putting faith into action. God wants everyone to take their talents and faith and put them into action to serve others. OCC has developed a fantastic missions program that is setting a standard with outreach programs by utilizing members' talents and skills.

Since hopping off the bike after crossing the country, I thanked God for His guidance and safety and began praying for another mission in which I could support through cycling. God has answered my prayers with a unique challenge that excites me and sometimes scares me. In September 17th -18th of this year, I will be attempting a 400 mile bike race in Ohio. I will have 32 hours to complete the distance. The inspiration to attempt such a ride comes from the number 400. Marty mentioned in a sermon that the

Israelites were enslaved for 400 years by the Egyptians. Today, people are enslaved around the world by medical issues, misinformation about unplanned pregnancies, disaster, and the lack of opportunity to support their families. I will be riding to support 4 missions; IDES, FAME, Mission Resource, & Clarity of South Central Indiana in order to raise funds to help free people from suffering.

I'd appreciate prayer for safety as I train and for people to open their hearts to the needs presented in this

mission. More information will be coming on how to support this unique mission effort.
